Both the Pixy and St Julian A rootstocks are used for Plums and Gages. Apricots, Peaches and Nectarines are only available on St Julian A.

Considerations when choosing a tree:

As well as providing fruit, the tree will be decorative, can provide shelter, can act as a screen and sound barrier, provide shade and attract wildlife.

Ensure the tree is appropriate for your area and use.

Is it hardy enough and will it stand frosts?

Will it flower or bear fruit when required?

Remember that some varieties have ornamental value in their fruits and blossom.

Be aware of micro-climates where weather conditions vary from normal.

Take care if the site is north facing or windy, factors which will limit your choice.

Consider the size and study possible rootstocks. Imagine the tree in twenty years.
